

## APPROVAL FOR VOLUNTEER SERVICE

In the Event of a Major Disaster or Public Health Emergency

The Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) has developed a volunteer registry for medical and non-medical professionals who might be available to respond in the event of a local, state and/or national disaster or bioterrorism event. This registry of health professionals is called the "Show-Me Response" program. Identifying these individuals in advance allows the registry to verify their credentials in order to place volunteers in appropriate assignments based on their professional level of expertise and education.

Volunteers are never required to respond to any given call for services. Volunteers also designate whether they would be interested in serving at the local, state and/or national level, and for what period of time they might be available, i.e., two to seven days, two weeks, etc. For more information on the Show-Me Response program, go to the DHSS website at <a href="https://www.showmeresponse.org">www.showmeresponse.org</a> or call 1-800-392-0272.
